



GERON STOKES



Geron Stokes is currently the head football coach at Dublin Coffman High School in Dublin, Ohio. In the classroom, he has led students in two leadership classes for which he wrote the curriculum. As part of The Learning Leader team, Geron creates the curriculum, teaches leadership development with executive teams, and facilitates learning leader circles.

Geron is a high school graduate of Urbana High School and has an undergraduate degree in special education from Urbana University. In high school, Geron played football as a four-year starter at quarterback and eventually became a three-year starter and captain while in college.

On the field, Coach Stokes has earned several Coach of the Year honors while guiding his teams to multiple conference championships and making playoff appearances in 12 of his 15 seasons as a head coach. His 2014 and 2017 teams were crowned Ohio High School Football State Champions and his 2016 team finished as the state runner-up. With multiple district, regional and state finalists, nothing competes with Coach Stokes's unique emphasis on his mission to maximize people through time, effort, and an extensive character development program.

Before Dublin Coffman, Coach Stokes spent eight years as the head coach at Minster High School in rural Northwest Ohio where he taught intervention and leadership. Before his time at Minster, Coach Stokes was named the head football coach at his alma mater, Urbana High School. He spent four years at Urbana as a coach and teacher. Coach Stokes crossed paths with Brook Cupps when they coached basketball together at Graham High School from 2008-2009 where their team advanced to the school's first-ever state final-four appearance and finished an unprecedented two-year run.
